



# REMEMBERING 'ALL' IN THIS SEASON OF REMEMBRANCE

In the season of Remembrance, we consider those who have heroically given their lives in war. However, Jesus calls all of us to a radical heroism in our daily lives: "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbour and hate your enemy.' But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven." (Matt 5:43-45).

### **Love Your Enemies**

Our 'enemies' are rarely life-threatening; they can simply be impatient, judgmental, self-righteous or just plain disagreeable! Whether the conflict is with a family or church member, work colleague or neighbour, our attitude toward them should be one of love. We will naturally want to retaliate, but Jesus commands us to love!

### **Pray for Your Persecutors**

It's only when we are ready to pray for someone whom we find difficult, that God can soften our attitude towards them. Like us, they are those in need of God's forgiveness and grace. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German pastor executed by the Nazis at the end of World War 2, wrote: "This is the supreme demand. Through the medium of prayer, we go to our enemy, stand by his side, and plead for him to God. For if we pray for them, we are taking their distress and

poverty, their guilt and perdition upon ourselves and pleading to God for them."

#### Become More Like Jesus

When we start loving our enemies and praying for our persecutors, we become more like Jesus Himself. He willingly laid down His life for us, prayed for His persecutors and gives us the power to love our enemies as He did.

At a time when we recognise that we all need heroes; how will we respond to this call to radical heroism in our own life?

This month of remembering is marked by:

All Souls-tide Memorial Service at St George's, Eastergate at 3pm on Sunday 2 November, when we remember by name particularly those whose funerals have taken place this last year and also any of our departed loved ones whether it be recent or some time ago.


**All Souls Day Requiem Mass** at St Mary's Barnham on Monday 3 November at 6.30pm when we remember by name the faithful departed as part of the service.

Remembrance Sunday (Sunday 9 November) is marked with an Act of Remembrance at 10.55am at the service at Barnham (War Memorial is in the church), followed by a Sung Requiem Mass at 11.15am; and following the 10am Parish Communion at Aldingbourne at the St George's altar. At Eastergate there is an Allage service in Church at 10am and then the Act of Remembrance at Eastergate War Memorial at 10.55am.

On **Remembrance Day** (Tuesday 11 November) at 11am there will be a short act of Remembrance at the War Memorial in the churchyard of St Mary's. Aldingbourne.

Members were then divided into small groups and asked to order a series of offences from least to most serious. We did not find this easy! There are always two sides to each case. It was a very interesting morning.

We had hope that Ben and Rob would come in an engine but maybe another time. They would be more than welcome.

### YOUR FUNERAL

The best time to plan your funeral is... NOW! November is when we remember the dead (All Saints and Remembrance). But what about vour own funeral?

It will happen sometime, whether soon or years in the future. Some preparation by you now will save your loved ones a lot of uncertainty later. So, this month, why not spend some time thinking about what you want for your own funeral?

Most funerals in England are Christian. though the officially recorded number of Church of England funerals tends to be limited to those which are conducted by parish clergy and Readers. The minister at others may be retired, or a hospital or military Chaplain.

the British Humanist Association or the National Secular Society. A growing number are conducted by civil celebrants, who tend to devise a format concentrating on the story of the person who has died, with God as an afterthought, though Christian prayers or texts from other religions may be incorporated.

Parishioners may not realise that they have the right to the services of the Rector, even if they don't go to church. They also have the right to be interred in the churchyard if it is open for burials.

The trend in funerals at the moment is to make them a celebration of the life of the deceased person. Although your wish - and that of your family - may be to make your funeral a joyful occasion, it does no one any good to suppress grief. A Christian service should make room for sadness as well as gratitude. It is also an act of worship, in which reverence should be paid to God, the source and goal of life. His judgment, generosity and mercy and the Christian hope in resurrection through Jesus Christ should be central.

A sensitive funeral service will also help mourners to contemplate the most fundamental issues of our existence. The Christian hope can be an unexpected encouragement, not least when people claim to have little faith of their own.

You can talk all this over with the Rector in confidence. You don't have to be terminally ill to do so! He or she knows you are precious to God and will be able to explain all the options and share some ideas.

Now for some practical considerations:

First of all, if you are an organ donor, where can your consent form be found? Find out more at www.organdonation.nhs.uk.

Do tell your Executor and next of kin where your Will is kept. Details of your funeral wishes (see box on opposite page) can be A few funeral events are led by nominees of kept with it or in a more accessible place. It is useful to maintain a list of family, friends, neighbours. acquaintances and colleagues who should be notified of your death and the funeral arrangement.

### What happens to you after death?

Whether your body is buried or cremated, the remains degenerate and go back into the earth. That's where they belong, for our bodies are composed of the earth's elements. Your dead body expressed the real 'you' during your lifetime.

But once it has done its job, that is not the finish! When Christians say, "I believe in... the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting", it means that we await the new destiny which God has opened for us, with a transformed body apposite for its new environment.

Some claim that the human soul is immortal, but that is not a Christian belief. We do not become disembodied spirits floating around the ether, but will be refashioned recognisable human beings. This will be as momentous an event as the emergence of the human race from its primitive beginnings.

St Paul faced hard questioning on the subject. If you have a look at the whole of 1 Corinthians 15 you will see how he couples our bodily resurrection with the Resurrection of Christ. Resurrection was central to the apostles' preaching and teaching. The Christian faith would be valueless without it, for Christ demands that we live our lives sacrificially with our hope beyond the horizon.

All this is much more than a collection of statements of faith. They could seem arid to a dying person. It is an invitation to take a conscious decision to trust Jesus the Christ. Our life before and beyond the grave belongs to Christ. He is the pioneer who charted the course through death; He accompanies us on our journey; He is our advocate at the Last Judgment; He is worshipped in heaven, and He alone is the Saviour who bore the brunt of human sin and gave His life to overcome its consequences. Trust him!

### WHEN THERE IS NO PEACE

They dress the wound of My people as though it were not serious. "Peace, peace," they say, when there is no peace. (Jeremiah 6:14)

I wonder what peace felt like in 1945, after 9 May or 16 August? These were the days after Victory in Europe Day and then Victory in Japan Day. After the parties and hangovers, life would go on as before, for many months to come: with shortages, men overseas, houses bombed and people on the move.

What does it feel like now? Yes, we have had 'peace' of sorts in most of Europe between the major continental powers for decades, which is an achievement, but there is no peace in Ukraine, the Middle East or Sudan. If anything, the world is now looking to be a more dangerous place.

This verse from the prophet Jeremiah was the

theme of a sermon recently. The preacher talked about peace making, peace keeping and a lasting peace, which are not the same and require different skills. In and after WW2 peace making meant winning the war and defeating evil. Peace keeping was occupying the defeated lands until they could establish communities built on democracy and justice.

What about a lasting peace? Many world leaders say, "Peace, Peace" but they mean only peace on their terms and do not care about anything else.

As Christians we should:

Pray for the peace makers: the women and men in the forces

Pray for peace keepers: the experts helping to build new societiesPray for lasting peace: the willingness of world leaders and politicians to act for the greater good.

### HIGH DAYS & HOLY DAYS

#### 11 November The poppies Remembrance Sunday

In late 1914, World War I erupted across Northern France and Flanders. Great swathes of previously green fields and forests were destroyed, leaving a bleak landscape, with seemingly every living thing destroyed.

But then in the Spring of 1915, something beautiful began to come out of all the destruction. Tens of thousands of bright red Flanders poppies began to put out tentative shoots across the endless vistas of mud. These resilient little flowers had flourished in the middle of so much chaos and destruction, because their seeds grow when exposed to sunlight, through disturbances to soil.

In Handers Felde

In Handers fields the proppies grow Between the crosses, now on row That mark our place: and in the sky The larks their bravely suigury, fly Scarce hears and the your below.

We are the Nead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, sour sunset glow, fored, and wereloved, and now we hie In Handers fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you from failing haws we throw The Forch : be yours to hold it high! If ye breakfaith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies goor In Handers fields.

cheerful poppies, growing in the midst of such misery and destruction, were what inspired the Canadian doctor, Lieutenant of Colonel John McCrae, to write the now famous poem 'In Flanders Fields'.

And it was McCrae's poem which inspired an American academic named Moina Michael to adopt the poppy in memory of those who had fallen in the war. She got it adopted as an official symbol of Remembrance across the United States, and worked with others who were trying to do the same in Canada, Australia, and the UK.

A French woman, Anna Guérin who was in the UK in 1921, caught the same vision, and planned to sell the poppies in London. There she met Earl Haig, the founder of the Royal British Legion, who was persuaded to adopt the poppy as its emblem in the UK.

We all know that these endless fields of The Royal British Legion, which had been formed in 1921, ordered nine million poppies and sold them on 11 November that year. Ever since then, the red poppy has been a symbol of Remembrance, of support for the Armed Forces community, and also of hope for a peaceful future.

### 17 November - Gregory of Tours, charity and compassion in dangerous times

Danger of assassination, lootings, floods, famines and epidemics... life in 6th Century France was as turbulent and violent as many of the world's hot spots are now. In the midst of all this, Gregory (539 – 94) was born into a senatorial family who lived in the Auvergne.

He grew up seeing how the Church responded to all this social chaos at first hand: his family numbered several bishops, as well as saints (the two are not necessarily the same thing!). In due course Gregory decided to devote his life also to the Church, and so was ordained deacon in 563 and elected bishop of Tours in 573.

Gregory should be the patron saint of anyone who climbs to a powerful and privileged position – and then uses it in order to do great good. As a bishop of Merovingian Gaul, he became an expounder and defender of the Christian faith and of public morality. He practised charity and compassion on a large scale. He repaired churches, including the great Tours cathedral, destroyed by fire, and built new ones. He restored the tombs of martyrs and saints. He visited monasteries and nunneries, and also founded schools.

In addition to all this, Gregory was a prodigious author of books. His ten volume History of the Franks is his most famous work, but he wrote on saints as well. He had an advantage on other medieval historians such as Bede in that he had first-hand experience of the court-life of his time. Courts were treacherous places, and Gregory had to deal with four civil rulers of Tours during his 21 years as bishop.

He must have earned their respect: he was sent on diplomatic missions to other Frankish kings. Gregory made the most of every opportunity he had to bring Christian standards of living into those dark days in France. He was greatly loved, and long remembered.

### ALL IN THE MONTH OF **NOVEMBER**

It was... 175 years ago, on 19 November 1850 that Alfred, Lord Tennyson, became Poet Laureate of the UK (until 1892).

125 years ago, on 22 November 1900 that Arthur Sullivan, British composer, died. Best known for his collaborations with the dramatist W S Gilbert on operas including H.M.S. Pinafore and The Pirate of Penzance. Soldiers.

100 years ago, on 27 November 1925 that Ernie Wise, TV comedian and actor, was born. Best known for his comedy partnership with Eric Morecambe, he died in 1999.

90 years ago, on 6 November 1935 that Britain's Hawker Hurricane fighter plane made its first flight. It played a major role in WWII. especially during the Battle of Britain.

65 years ago, on 8 November 1960, that John F Kennedy was elected as the 35th President of the USA.

60 years ago, on 9 November 1965 that the death penalty was abolished in the UK.

50 years ago, on 3 November 1975 that Britain's first North Sea oil pipeline was officially opened.

40 years ago, on 15 November 1985 that the Anglo-Irish Agreement was signed by the Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher and Irish President Garret Fitzgerald. It gave the Irish government a consultative role in the affairs of Northern Ireland.

He also wrote the hymn Onward. Christian 25 years ago, on 9 November 2000 that Eric Morley, TV host, died. Known for establishing the ballroom dancing competition Come Dancing (1949 - 98). It was succeeded by Strictly Come Dancing, in 2004.

> 10 years ago, on 13 November 2015 that the Paris attacks took place when bombers and armed terrorists from Islamic State (IS) attacked a football stadium, rock concert, cafes and restaurants, 130 people were killed and 416 injured. IS said the attacks were in retaliation for French air-strikes on IS targets in Syria and Irag.

### **ARTHUR SULLIVAN**

Some 125 years ago, on 22 November 1900, Arthur Sullivan, the British composer, died. Best known for his collaborations with the dramatist W.S.Gilbert on light operas including *HMS Pinafore* and *The Pirates of Penzance*, he also wrote the music to the hymn *Onward*, *Christian Soldiers*.

Sullivan was born in 1832 in Lambeth. His Irish-born father Thomas was a military bandmaster, clarinettist and music teacher who, from 1845 to 1857 was based at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, where his son became proficient on many of the band's instruments and composed an anthem, *By the Waters of Babylon*, when he was eight.

Arthur was drawn to classical and spiritual music of various kinds, and his huge success with Gilbert was awkward for him, as he often felt — encouraged by certain reviewers and others — that he was "capable of higher art". He was knighted by Queen Victoria in 1883,

and the musical establishment felt this should end his involvement with comic opera.

Sullivan was inclined to agree, but he was also aware of the quality — and popularity — of his work with Gilbert. He had told an American reporter in 1879: "His ideas are as suggestive for music as they are quaint and laughable. His numbers ... always give me musical ideas."

By 1885 the duo had completed *The Mikado*, their most successful work, which ran for 672 performances.

Sullivan never married, though he had close relationships with a number of women, including the American socialite and singer Fanny Ronalds. He was devoted to his mother and also to his nephews and nieces after his brother Fred died at an early age.

Kidney disease often meant that Sullivan had to conduct sitting down. He died of heart failure following bronchitis. His *Te Deum Laudamus* was performed posthumously.

### VILLAGE FRIENDS

Village Friends held its AGM in September at Nylon House Care Home. The chairman and co-ordinator delivered her report which reflected another busy year for all involved. Village Friends is currently supporting 20 people in their homes and a further smaller number through coffee mornings and outings. Three social lunches had taken place with almost 30 people coming to each.

Building on the success of earlier years a new development during this past year has been an increase in outings, not only to the theatre but also to the Aviation Museum at Tangmere, to the Wetland Centre in Arundel, and twice to the Spitfire Cafe for lunch and a sing-song.

None of this would be possible without the wonderful commitment of our volunteers.
