

This charity was established in 1993 to provide financial/emotional and respite care to families, at home, who have children with life limiting or terminal illnesses. Hospital care is provided by paediatric nurses and counsellors through the trust, while links are still retained with the NHS and the hospitals the children are involved with.

The charity provides support for 0 - 19 year old children who live within a 15 mile radius of Chichester with their offices based in Westhampnett. Over half a million pounds is needed each year to provide their services and this is achieved through fund raising and donations. Some of this money is also used to provide fun family days out and respite weekends for parents which are very much needed and appreciated. The trust also supports a number of children at Fordwater School in Chichester.

It is very obvious, through Diane's informative talk, that the Snowdrop Trust is run by amazing and committed people, including volunteers, who provide a valuable and necessary service to some extremely vulnerable young people and their families within our society.

ALDINGBOURNE BELL RINGING

and other solemn occasions, including Sunday. Remembrance Other davs include Good Friday and New Year's Eve.

On these occasions, the bells are half-muffled. where one side of the clapper (the metal part of the bell which hangs inside the bell) is covered with a leather pad, which dulls the sound of the bell when the clapper strikes. This is usually done on the backstroke, so the clapper strikes once without the pad and then with the pad, which produces an echo effect.

Fully muffled bells (when both sides of the clapper are covered) are only used for the death of the monarch, the death of the diocesan bishop or the incumbent vicar. Muffling the bells probably dates from the 1600s in England, when change ringing started. Change ringing is when a group of ringers systematically change the order of the bells following a particular pattern or sequence, or just change the order of the bells called by one of the ringers. The patterns have exotic names such as Cambridge Surprise, Grandsire and Aladdin Bob Doubles.

On Saturday 8 November, twelve ringers from the Western District of the Sussex County Association of Change Ringers rang the half-Mary's muffled bells at St. Church. Aldingbourne, before service ٥f а

Remembrance to remember the bell ringers who served in the First and Second World Church bells are often muffled for funerals Wars and more recent conflicts, and those who gave their lives in service. The service can was followed by tea, cake and sandwiches. The bells were also rung half-muffled before the service on Remembrance Sunday.

> The bells at St.Mary's, Aldingbourne, are rung on Sundays and special occasions. The bell ringers practise on Monday evenings between 7.30pm and 9.00pm. Anyone who wishes to learn how to ring and experienced ringers are most welcome. We have five bells St.Mary's. Please contact Claire Tunnell for more information (claire.tunnell@gmail.com).

YOUR COUNTDOWN TO CHRISTMAS — 20 IDEAS

- 1. **Plan your budget.** Don't let Christmas 'fever' make you reckless.
- 2. **Practical details.** Make sure you have in a good stock of coal and logs, Christmas tree lights that work, a clean oven, a stock of candles and matches, and spare batteries.
- 3. Choose a colour theme. Red? Gold? Purple? Silver? Then use it on everything from your candles, tree baubles and wrapping paper, to table napkins and Christmas cards and lights.
- 4. **Hang a wreath**. You can buy one, or get creative with a mixture of garden foliage.
- 5. **Enjoy any Christmas fairs and markets.** Also, consider taking a housebound person with you, or someone who may be lonely.
- 6. The trip to Bethlehem. Dig out your nativity set, and start Mary and Joseph and the donkey at the top of your stairs moving them a bit closer to the manger downstairs each day. And don't forget to start the wise men on their way!
- 7. **Plan your Christmas lunch early.** Try and think of everything that you will need on the day and make sure you have it ordered or bought in good time.
- 8. Think about decorating your table. You could use holly and ivy and narcissi and snowdrops... and lots of red ribbon.
- 9. **Pick the perfect tree.** Bear in mind that an artificial tree is not just for Christmas, but for life.... all that non-renewable plastic will spend eternity in some landfill site. So why not branch out and look for the real thing.
- 10. Display your cards with style.
- 11. **Deck the halls.** Would your front entrance hall take a small tree, wreath, or maybe just a bowl of pretty sweets? Run a garland up the

- banister. Add some ivy and some fairy lights.
- 12. **Donate to charities** who help the homeless and the migrants.
- 13. **Sing carols** and play carols at home. Remind your family what Christmas is really all about.
- 14. **Wrap those presents.** What you get and how you wrap it will say a lot about your attitude towards the person you are giving to! So, select your presents and wrapping materials with care. Adding some ribbon is well worth the effort.
- 15. **Fill those Christmas stockings.** A must for Christmas mornings.
- 16. Give your pets some extra care. If you have a curious dog or cat, avoid tinsel on the tree, keep a watchful eye on the turkey bones on Christmas Day. Also, don't leave scraps of wrapping paper around. Finally, ensure your pets can find a quiet place to rest if all the family is there.
- 17. **Go crackers.** In 1847 the confectioner Tom Smith invented the Christmas cracker. Legend says that he spotted a beautifully wrapped French bon-bon, and had a 'eureka moment'. In effect, he said to himself: "What that bon-bon needs is a tiny plastic key-ring, an awful pun on a piece of paper, and a tissue paper hat, all crammed into an exploding toilet roll." The rest is history.
- 18. Read your children the Christmas story. There are any number of excellent children's books which tell it with wonderful illustrations.
- 19. **Make sure your neighbours are all right.** Is there anyone who could use a helping hand? Anyone needing a lift to church?
- 20. On Christmas Eve/Christmas, make time to have a family reading of the Nativity stories in Matthew and Luke. As a family, make time to praise God for the gift of Jesus!

HIGH DAYS & HOLY DAYS

13 December – Lucy, Martyr at Syracuse

Lucy was a Christian girl who got caught up in the fierce and widespread Diocletian persecutions of 303-4. She refused to give up her Christian faith, and so was put to death. Her tomb can still be found in a Catacomb in Syracuse, and there are early fourth-century inscriptions bearing her name (Euskia).

Lucy's full story has been lost in the mists of time, but a romantic legend of her martyrdom grew up after her death. According to the legend, Lucy was arrested while giving to the poor at the height of the persecution. Her own fiancé had betrayed her, telling the authorities about her faith. The judge ordered that she be raped in a brothel and then burned, but all attempts to inflict such punishment on her

went amiss, because God protected her. At last, Lucy was killed by the sword.

Lucy's legend was written in the 5th century, and she was honoured in Rome from the 6th century. The name Lucy means 'light', and so in time she became the patron saint for those with eye diseases. Her feast day is close to the shortest day of the year, so it is celebrated in Sweden as a festival of light.

As the full details of Lucy's martyrdom will never be known, she can represent all the young women who have been willing to die for Christ, and whose full stories will also never be known to us.

26 December - St Stephen, the first martyr

Have you ever stopped to consider that the very first martyr of the Christian Church was a deacon? (But no, he wasn't worked to death by his church.) It was Stephen, one of the first seven deacons of the Christian Church. He'd been appointed by the apostles to look after the distribution of alms to the faithful poor, and to help in the ministry of preaching.

Acts 6 and 7 tells us all that we know of his life, and the passages seem to suggest that he was an educated Hellenistic Jew. Certainly, Stephen's famous challenge to the Jews reveals him to have been learned in the Scriptures and the history of Judaism, besides being eloquent and forceful.

Stephen's proclamation on the day of his martyrdom pulled no punches. He told the Jews that God did not depend on the Temple. The Temple was but a temporary institution destined to be fulfilled and superseded by Christ, who was the prophet foreseen by Moses as the Messiah for whom the Jewish race had so long awaited.

Stephen then challenged his hearers for resisting the Spirit and for killing the Christ, as their fathers before them had killed the prophets. The Jews were so outraged by this

that they stoned Stephen on the spot for blasphemy.

As he died, (c 35 AD) Stephen saw a vision of Christ on God's right hand. The men who were witness to the stoning placed their clothes at the feet of Saul (afterwards Paul), who (to his deep regret later) consented to Stephen's death.

By the fourth century Stephen had his own dav in both East and Churches. When his supposed tomb was discovered in 415, his popularity soared. His relics were taken to Constantinople and then Rome, along with some stones (allegedly) used at his martyrdom.

Early on the Church made Stephen the patron saint of deacons. In the Middle Ages he was also invoked to help against headaches (?!).

In England, 46 ancient churches are dedicated to him, most of them built after the Norman Conquest. In art Stephen is usually given a book of the Gospels and a stone, and Saint Stephen the Martyr by Carlo Crivelli. Part sometimes the palm of martyrdom.

WHY IS THE RECTOR WEARING WHITE TODAY?

You may have noticed that the priest who officiates at Church Services wears vestments (chasuble and stole) of different colours. This can be white, purple, red or green and sometimes rose pink and black.

White is for festive occasions like Christmas and Easter, christenings and weddings. Purple is worn during Advent and Lent, when we bring to mind our sins and seek God's forgiveness, in preparation for the wonderful seasons of Christmas and Easter. Red at Pentecost, symbolises the fire of the Holy Spirit, and on Saints Days it signifies that many of them (and some today) were martyred because they were Christians. Green, marking growth and hope is worn for the rest of the year.

So, white for 'best', purple for penitence, red

for the Holy Spirit and the blood of the Martyrs, and green for growth.

At the Eucharist/Mass/Holv Communion we use vessels which are called the Paten and Chalice. The Paten is like a plate on which the bread is placed. A vessel called a Ciborium. may be used for the same purpose. The Chalice is a cup for the wine. Because the bread and wine become for us the Body and Blood of Christ, which He sacrificed for us when He was crucified, we handle them with care and honour.

The minister's ceremonial robes, called vestments, and the vessels all point to something greater. In one of St Paul's letters in the New Testament, he explains in these words that receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion has past, present and future significance: "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes."
