CHRISTIAN GIVING

I have just got back from the Diocesan Clergy Conference in Canterbury where we had time amongst other things to 'be', to 'think' and to 'wonder' in God's presence as well as learn, pray, worship, meet and greet many colleagues. Precious, valuable days.

On returning to the parish I was made very aware of the realities of caring for our precious buildings and the financial implications in doing so.

We have just received the news that the Chancel ceiling at St Mary's, Aldingbourne, has to be replaced at an estimated cost of £20,000. Also Chris, our Treasurer, reminded the PCC that we are living 'hand to mouth' with our day to day income and expenses which means that when 'surprises' like this come, we do not have the resources to meet the bills that come our way. We therefore need to think about support of that work, small or large donations being welcomed and also our week by week response. Why would we want to do this?

Of course, Jesus taught a great deal about money and its dangers. Most of his parables concerned money in one form or another. He used the word 'Mammon' to describe a false financial god, saying "You can't serve God and Mammon."

A right attitude to money

Until we are released from the straitjacket of putting money before God, that blocked soulartery will impede our way to God.

Once liberated from the control money has over us, we can be lavish in our giving — with a sense of exuberance. St Paul puts it like this: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

St Paul spent ten years raising funds for the impoverished Church in Jerusalem where there was a serious famine. The little and very poor Church in Macedonia gave way beyond their comfort zone. The relatively wealthy Church in Corinth gave little by comparison. Paul contrasts them. Miserable Corinthians; joyful Macedonians.

Giving is fun

Christian giving becomes something we share privately with Jesus. In Matthew Jesus taught that, when we give, we should not let even our left hand know what our right hand is doing.

God is generous to us, so when we are generous, we share a secret with him. "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich."


Giving to God is giving back what he has already given to us. It's not the quantity, it's the percentage of what we have.

A right attitude to money is vital for Christians.

What is our response to be? To God? To ABE?

MAGGIE'S FUND SEES AV COME TO ST GEORGE'S

The afternoon of Sunday 14 September saw an event celebrating the culmination of fundraising for a project inspired by the late Maggie Courtnadge. 'Maggie's Fund' had been set up in 2023 to fund the installation of an audio-visual (AV) system in St George's church. The project, recently completed, was celebrated at an inaugural service of dedication and thanksgiving, led by Fr Paul to a packed congregation.

The new AV system comprises a projector, drop-down screen, loudspeakers and computer, and is well-integrated into the fabric of the church. During the entire

service, the screen was used with, for the first time, no necessity for hymn books or other written material. The joyous service included a recollection of the reasons why AV would be so beneficial to the life of the church and the St George's community. We were reminded of the fundraising journey that had been undertaken to achieve it and were told how the system might be used, with examples demonstrated on the screen.

The service included traditional hymns and several contemporary worship songs, with all words and music displayed on the screen. Readings were given by Maggie's son, Andy, and her daughter, Zoe. Revd Sheila gave an address based on one of the readings.

Copious amounts of tea and cake followed the service!

The Rector and churchwardens wish to thank all those who contributed so generously to Maggie's Fund and who supported the AV project from its inception. Thanks also to those who helped make this inaugural event such an enjoyable and uplifting service.

ST MARY'S CHURCH ALDINGBOURNE — AN APPEAL

Over past weeks there have been a couple of falls of plaster from the chancel ceiling in St Mary's, and regular falls of plaster dust and particles over the altar and the choir stalls.

The church architect has visited, and is of the opinion that the nineteenth century plaster has lost its key to the supporting laths, and the wide area of falling particles indicates this is universal, such that the whole ceiling needs to be replastered. As there is a risk of injury from falling debris, the chancel has now been roped off and the altar moved down to the front of the nave.

Initial quotes for repair work indicate a cost in the region of £20,000 to erect a scaffolding cage in the chancel, and replace the 36 panels of lath and plaster using traditional methods.

SHARE A LITTLE LIGHT THIS HALLOWEEN

Some parents aren't sure quite what to feel about Hallowe'en – is it just harmless fun, or are there aspects of it that don't fit in with how we want to see the world?

A child's christening service is very honest about the reality of good and evil, and Hallowe'en can be a good time to talk about those things and how the love of Jesus can be a 'Light in the darkness' for everyone.

The word "hallowe'en" actually means "the eve of all hallows' day" – in other words, the night before the church's festival celebrating All Saints.

The famous saints are all amazing examples of what it's like to live God's way. But in the Bible, St Paul calls all Christians saints — a saint is simply a friend of God, who seeks to live their life according to God's purposes. When someone is christened, they truly become a Saint, so All Saints' Day is a celebration of the whole family of God.

If you'd like to mark Hallowe'en, here are some ideas that will bless others as well as being fun.

What's happening in church? Some churches hold special events around this time of year. There might be a 'Light Party' with fun activities for children and young people these events are a lovely way to focus on all that's life-giving and positive around All Hallows. Some churches also have a special service for All Souls Day – a time when we remember our loved ones who have died. Carve a pumpkin. Did you know that gargoyles were originally made in medieval times to scare away evil spirits? The pumpkins with scary faces carved into them at Hallowe'en are a bit like that. But Christians believe that you can't fight evil with evil - you can only fight evil with good, and that good

will always win in the end. So why not see if you can carve a friendly looking pumpkin this year, as a sign that you and your family are going to be a force for good this Hallowe'en/You can do the same with Hallowe'en costumes. Superheroes make a great, positive alternative to scary witches and ghosts.

Give a treat. Not everyone is comfortable with the idea of children going round to neighbours' and just asking for treats. But if you don't want them to miss out on something their friends are doing, why not have a family baking session, and take a tray of cookies with you if you go out with them? That way, you have something lovely to give away to your neighbours, too!

Say a goodnight prayer. Even if you've steered clear of scary costumes, and even if your child has loved the evening, it can be reassuring to have a goodnight prayer that reminds them that love, and light, and good, are always stronger than fear and evil.

The service of Compline (Night Prayer) has been used in this way for centuries, and many of its prayers are still used today: "Visit this place, O Lord, we pray and drive far from it all snares of the enemy; let Your holy angels dwell with us to preserve us in peace; and let Your blessing be upon us always, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

Or, in a simpler children's version: "Be with us, Lord, and take away all fear, may your angels protect us and give us peace. And bless us always. Amen."

You can use these lovely prayers any time when you need a reminder that God is with you — especially at the end of a difficult day, or when something sad has happened, or when your family is worried about something.

HIGH DAYS & HOLY DAYS

1 October - Theresa of Lisieux

Theresa of Lisieux (1873-97) should be the patron saint of teenage girls and young women who want to make the most of their lives, despite being constrained by family and school or work.

Theresa grew up in a strict, devout Roman Catholic middle-class family in France, one of four sisters. Her father was a watch-maker. Like her sisters, she entered a Carmelite After Theresa died in 1897, her book just went convent at 15, and stayed there. She was never able to go anywhere, do anything extraordinary, or hold any responsibility. She died at the age of 24 of tuberculosis. Yet this quiet young Carmelite nun became so nationally popular that she was declared patroness of France 50 years after her death. much!

So how did Theresa do it? By not intending to do it at all. Theresa never set out to become famous: instead, she quietly determined in her spirit to seek God, and, having found Him, to

honour Him in her life, to live as closely as she could to the teaching in the gospels.

The result was a life so spiritually radiant that her convent asked her to write a short spiritual autobiography of her pilgrimage. Theresa obliged with 'L'Histoire d'une Ame', which soon became so popular that it was translated into most European languages and several Asiatic ones. Theresa also prayed for people who were ill, and there are many reports of miraculous healings that took place in answer.

on selling. People found the artless sweet simplicity of her observations on pilgrimage as a Christian compelling. Theresa reminded people of what Christianity was really all about: simple but utter devotion to Christ, not endless outward observance of religion. Theresa helped many in the Roman Not bad for someone who didn't get out Catholic Church in France to remember the first principles of their faith.

9 October - Denys of Paris

Have you ever held your head in your hands and felt that events were against you?

Then Denys is the saint for you. This Christian martyr knew all about holding his head in his hands when times got rough.

According to Gregory of Tours, Denys was an Italian bishop who became the first bishop of Paris. Along with five other bishops, he had been sent by the Pope to convert all of Gaul. Denvs reached Paris, where the common people welcomed him, and his preaching was met with great popular success. In time he even went on to establish a Christian centre on an island in the Seine. That was the beginning of Christianity in Paris.

However, Gaul was still under Roman rule. and trouble began for Denvs when in the year 250 the Emperor Decius issued an unusual Roman imperial edict. All the citizens of >>

<< the empire were required to sacrifice to the Emperor in order to prove their loyalty to the old ways. Once they had sacrificed, they could obtain a libellous (certificate) to prove they had complied. This sacrifice was of course out of the question for any Christian, and Denys and several leading Christians in Paris refused. Soon Denys, along with a priest called Rusticus and a deacon called Eleutherius, were imprisoned and beheaded.

So loved had Denys been by the people that stories soon sprang up about how he had then picked up his head and carried it for ten kilometres, preaching a sermon as he walked. Today you can see a statue commemorating this unusual (!) event in the crypt of the Roman Catholic Basilica of Denys in Paris.

CELEBRATING 200 YEARS OF THE PUBLIC RAILROADS

Two hundred years ago, on 27 September 1825, the world's first public railway opened. It was the Stockton and Darlington Railway in north-east England.

Inspired and supported by a prominent Quaker, Edward Pease, and backed financially by many Quakers nationally, it has been described as "the great theatre of railway operations", sparking the explosion of railways across the world and boosting the industrial revolution. About 20 miles of the original 25 mile stretch still exist, now as part of the Northern Rail line.

The technical expertise behind it all came from George Stephenson, an extraordinary self-taught engineer whose expertise, which originated in the mines, stretched beyond railways. His Locomotion No 1, built for the Stockton and Darlington line, was the first steam locomotive to carry passengers on a public rail line. He worked with his 18-year-old son Robert, who is known for creating the more famous Rocket four years later.

The first Stockton and Darlington train — which in fact ran from Old Etherley Colliery, some distance north of Darlington — was led by a man on horseback with a flag. The motto of the organising committee was "At private risk for public service".

With brakemen stationed between the wagons, the train reached 12 to 15mph and was greeted by an estimated 10,000 people at the Darlington junction, where some passengers left and more boarded. The average speed was calculated at about 8mph. Six wagons of coal were given to the poor by way of celebration.

A nine-month festival in County Durham and the Tees Valley – with artwork, spectacles and community events – is marking the bicentenary of the opening of the railway.

As a tribute to his life and achievements, a bronze statue of George Stephenson was unveiled at Chesterfield railway station in 2005. An earlier statue stands in Neville Street, Newcastle.

Around one billion TV viewers around the world watched them being pulled was officially opened. It was the tallest to the surface one-by-one, in a specially designed capsule.

THOSE MAGNIFICENT MEN IN THEIR FLYING MACHINE...

It was 125 years ago, on 20 October 1900, that the American aviation pioneers the Wright Brothers made their first untethered glider flight at Kill Devil Hills in North Carolina.


This was a key moment in the history of aviation, although their first powered flight of a heavier-than-air aircraft came three years later, on 17th December 1903, also at Kill Devil Hills, which is near Kitty Hawk.

Orville and Wilbur Wright, who lived in Dayton, Ohio — more than 600 miles from Kitty Hawk — were the sons of a bishop in the Church of the United Brethren in Christ, and were both named after clergymen. However, they became inventive mechanics and owned a bicycle shop at a time when cycling was becoming safer and popular. They chose the Kitty Hawk area for flight attempts, based on

advice from the US Weather Bureau.

There had been many unpowered glider flights in Europe before, and the Wrights, who were in their thirties, were particularly impressed by the successful German pioneer Otto Lilienthal, who had been killed in 1896. The Wrights' big leap forward, however, was a system of three-axis controls that made fixedwing powered flight possible. It enabled the pilot to steer the aircraft and maintain its equilibrium. It remains standard on aircraft today.

Flying changed the world for us all. It had long been a dream, dating back at least as far as the Greek legend of Icarus and Daedalus, and including kite-flying in China and ballooning in 18th-century France, with the Montgolfier brothers. A small piece of the Wright Flyer is now on Mars — a piece of cloth attached to a small but active reconnaissance helicopter called Ingenuity.






