





FAIR ST GEORGE

This month we remember the story of St George defeating the dragon. Although this is the stuff of legend, we face our own dragons today. We are engaged in a spiritual battle against the powers of sin, Satan and death. In this Easter season, we remember that the great battle has been won. By His cross and resurrection, Jesus secured the victory over sin, Satan and death. The resurrection is the proof that they are no longer too powerful to resist. *'Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory?'* (1 Cor 15:54,55). *Where is your power, dragon?*

The story is told of a village in India, terrorised by a great bear looking for food each night. Eventually, the villagers decided to take action, and tracked down the bear to his cave. One man, stronger and braver than the rest, ventured into the dark cave. The villagers outside could hear nothing; eventually they heard a loud shrieking cry and then silence. They waited to see what had happened. Finally, the man emerged from the dark cave victorious! The bear was dead and the villagers were safe.

The victory was won deep within the cave. They could only be confident and celebrate when the champion emerged. For us, this happened when Jesus rose from the grave. The finality of death is no more and the power of sin and Satan no longer controls us. The devil, the biggest dragon, is helpless to prevent Jesus taking us home.

This year, we will be celebrating St George at St George's Church, Eastergate, on Sunday 21 April when Bishop Ruth Bushyager, Bishop of Horsham, will be our celebrant and preacher. The service will be at the slightly later time of 10.30am and will be followed by a Bring and Share Lunch. Please make sure that this is in your diaries!

THE STORY BEHIND THE HYMN: **CHRIST THE LORD IS RISEN** TODAY

Jesus's death on the cross. and His resurrection on Easter morning are both part of the redemption story. Paul links them in this way: 'He was delivered for our offences [the Crossl and raised again [the Resurrection] for our justification' (Romans 4:25). Charles Wesley does likewise in his His conquest of death He now shares with all glorious Easter anthem.

Christ the Lord is risen today! Sons of men and angels say. Raise your songs and triumph high Sing, ye heavens, thou earth reply.

Charles wrote the hymn in 1739, a year after his Pentecost Sunday evangelical conversion, and the year in which he began his open-air preaching. Like all his hymns that followed in the next four decades, this hymn is full of New Testament references and allusions. A great stone was rolled into the opening of the grave where Jesus was laid, and as Matthew records, the Jewish authorities 'made the Christ has conquered hell! Death has lost its tomb secure, sealing the stone and setting a sting! The grave is spoiled! What a Saviour! quard' (27:66). But all to no purpose! Christ, What a gospel! What a glorious hope! the Lord of Life, could not be imprisoned by death!

> Vain the stone, the watch, the seal Christ hath burst the gates of hell. Death in vain forbids Him rise Christ hath opened Paradise!

The NT teaches that Christ's resurrection was the Father's seal of approval on His obedient life and atoning death. His resurrection was the proof that He was indeed Jesus Christ the Lord, as Paul argues in Romans 1:4. 'Declared

to be the Son of God ... by the resurrection from the dead.' Charles Wesley works these great salvation truths into his verses. 'Love's redeeming work is done.' 'Once He died our souls to save.' 'Lives again our glorious King.' 'Where, O death, is now thy sting?' 'Second life we all receive.' In our Heavenly Adam live.' As our Lord promised His disciples long ago and still promises us; 'Because I live, you will also live' (John 14:19).

The Resurrection of Christ, viewed as a historical fact, is only part of the NT teaching. His people. Christians are the people of the Resurrection! We are now 'made alive with Christ;' 'raised up with Him,' and already seated 'in heavenly places' (Ephesians 1:4-6). And Charles Wesley takes up this great theme of how believers share in their Lord's resurrection power.

> Risen with Him we upward move Still we seek the things above ... Soar we now where Christ hath led Following our exalted Head. Made like Him, like Him we rise Ours the cross, the grave, the skies.

HIGH DAYS & HOLY DAYS

19 April – Alphege, the archbishop taken captive by Danes

Alphege is the saint for anyone who refuses to let others suffer on their behalf.

His is a tale of courage and self-sacrifice, with some details that are still poignant, even down 1,000 years of history.

Alphege began like many other leading churchmen of his time; born of a noble family, with a good education, he decided to become a monk. Alphege joined the Benedictine Abbey at Deerhurst in Gloucestershire, and then became a hermit at Bath, before becoming Abbot of Bath. From there, he was appointed to be Bishop of Winchester, where he was loved for his frugal lifestyle and great

generosity towards others.

In 954 King Ethelred the Unready sent Alphege as a peace envoy to the Danes, seeking some relief from the constant Viking raids against England. Alphege secured a time of peace, and in 1006 was made the 29th Archbishop of Canterbury.

But the Viking raids increased again, until the south of England was largely overrun. In 1012 they surrounded Canterbury, and with the help of a treacherous archdeacon, Elfmaer, captured and imprisoned Alphege. A vast sum was demanded by his captors, so much that it would have ruined the people of Canterbury. And so Alphege refused to be ransomed.

This infuriated the Danes, who wanted the gold of Canterbury, not the Archbishop. After seven months of ill-treating him, one night they got very drunk and began pelting him with ox-bones from their feast, until in a frenzy they hacked him to death with an axe.

Alphege was mourned as a national hero and venerated as a martyr: he had given his life in order to protect his people from harm.

23 April – St George and Hiccup and the dragon

Have you seen the film *How to Train your Dragon*? It's set in a Viking village under attack from dragons, who steal livestock and burn down houses. Hiccup, the village chief's son, invents a machine to capture dragons. However, when he catches one of the most dangerous dragons, he cannot kill it, when he sees that the dragon is just as frightened as he is. Through this friendship, the people and dragons eventually learn to live in harmony.

This month we celebrate St George, the patron saint of England. He is famous for slaying a dragon, a tradition which became popular in the Middle Ages. Whether he killed an actual dragon is open to question! However, we do know that the original George was a Roman soldier at the time of Emperor

Diocletian. He refused to renounce his faith, and rose again, so that we might have God's as commanded by the Emperor, resulting in power to do this in our lives. his death on 23 April 303 AD.

The contrast is clear: St George slaved the evil dragon, while Hiccup refused to kill one. However, they also have something important in common. Both acted according to their conscience. defying the popular understanding of those around them and not worrving about the personal cost to themselves. St George was martyred for standing up for his faith in Jesus before a pagan emperor, while Hiccup risked rejection by his father and village because of his compassion.

Today, we are still called to stand for Christ against wrongs and injustice in daily life, Please do come and welcome Bishop Ruth whatever the personal cost.

However, we also need to be ready to look our enemies in the eye and meet their hostility with love and compassion. This is why we also remember this month that Jesus died

BARNHAM & Eastergate Parish Council

The latest meeting of Barnham and Eastergate Parish Council took place on 12 March 2024. The agenda was focused on updates on various ongoing projects being undertaken by the Parish Council to support the community it serves and decisions on funding for some of these.

Road closures and flooding

There was discussion on the continuing issues of road closures, flooding and sewage problems and it was noted that Sue Wallsgrove, Parish and District Councillor, was in continual dialogue with Southern Water about bringing forward a solution to the

problem at the earliest opportunity. The main issue is that until the water table levels drop there is little Southern Water can do as they need to work on pipes that are currently below the water level.

The Council will continue to apply the necessary pressure to ensure works are carried out as soon as possible and that disruption is kept to a minimum for residents. but unfortunately we are in the hands of others in this area.

Working groups

As previously reported the council has now established working parties to take forward various projects the council has identified as areas they'd like to improve within the community it serves within the funding it has available.

The People, Places and Spaces (PPS) Working Party continues to work on improving the look of the Parish. Spring bulbs and flowers have been planted around our gateway signs, the lamppost planters have been planted and hung in the village and tidying up and planting around benches in the Parish has taken place. Work continues to create the Village Garden at Murrells Field and hopefully with Spring around the corner things can move on more swiftly.

The Community Resilience Team continues to prepare the community for emergency situations arising and continues to hold held First Aid Training courses, available to all, and has hosted a joint training session with the WSCC Resilience Team.

A working party has also been established to take forward the project to undertaken improvements to Murrells Field using section 106 funds received from the Angel's Nursery development. The first phase will be improving the drainage and establishing some recreational sports pitches. A consultation will take place before the final local group and would like a stand let us plans are agreed.

Walberton Pre-School

We have been celebrating World Book Day. There has been a lot of publicity in the media about the pressure that parents feel to create or purchase an outfit for their child so that they can dress up and go to school as their favourite book character. At Walberton Pre-School. we were ahead of the game ... We had signed up to World Book Day and this meant that we were able to give each of our pre-school children a token which can be redeemed for a World Book Day book, or used as part payment for another book of their choice. We sent a message to all of our parents, giving them the option for their child to come to pre-school wearing their pyjamas - bringing their favourite bedtime story with them. Everyone has pyjamas, so there is no cost involved.

The children loved it! Because we were still having 'normal' pre-school days, they were layered up underneath their PJs, and some had cosy dressing gowns on so they could still play outside...

We had one day which focussed on the Michael Rosen classic story, 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. 50 years ago, on 6 April 1974 that the Swedish pop group ABBA won the Eurovision Song Contest with their song Waterloo. It was the first time that Sweden won the contest. ABBA went on to be one of the most successful groups in music history.

20 years ago, on 1 April 2004 that Google launched its free email service, Gmail.

10 years ago, on 14 April 2014 that the Boko Haram Islamic terrorist group kidnapped 276 female students from the Government Girls Secondary School in Chibok, Nigeria. Some of the girls escaped, some were rescued, or have been reported dead. But over 100 are still missing, fate unknown.

50 YEARS OF ABBA!

Fifty years ago, on 6 April 1974, the Swedish pop group ABBA won the Eurovision Song Contest with their song Waterloo. It was the first time that Sweden won the contest. ABBA went on to be one of the most successful groups in music history.

The victory, in Brighton, was just the first step on the road to conquering the world, as far as pop music was concerned. The songs, written and Benny mainly bv Björn Ulvaeus Andersson, were matched by the passion. exuberance and good looks of sinaers and Anni-Frid 'Frida' Agnetha Fältskog Lyngstad, who later married them – and even later. divorced them.

The name of the group came from the initials of the four Christian names. Some have suggested a link to the biblical Abba and looked for Jewish themes in their songs, but this is wishful thinking. While Anni-Frid (who

was born Norwegian) may be Christian, Björn is definitely an outspoken atheist. In fact, ABBA is the name of a Swedish canned fish company that had to give permission for the singers to use it – a decision they are unlikely to have regretted.

Both Waterloo and ABBA achieved worldwide superstar status quickly – no small feat for a group performing in a language that is not their own. The film ABBA – the Movie and the musical Mamma Mia and its sequel, featuring their compelling songs, were huge successes. It is estimated that the musical has been seen by more than 60 million people worldwide.

ABBA hit the jackpot again when their revolutionary new project, ABBA Voyage, launched in 2022. In it, Agnetha, Björn, Benny and Anni-Frid perform their love-songs digitally with a live 10-piece band, in a purpose-built ABBA arena at Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park in London. Not bad for four divorcees in their 70s.

APPRECIATING JOHANN Sebastian Bach

Three hundred years ago, on 7 April 1724, the German composer Johann Sebastian Bach's St John Passion was performed for the first time, at a church in Leipzig.

It was put on as part of Good Friday Vespers St Nicholas Church. having at been transferred from St Thomas at the last moment by the music council. Bach, who had just turned 39, agreed to the move, while pointing out that the booklet had already been printed, there was no room immediately the musicians. and available for the harpsichord needed some repair. These problems were overcome.

Bach was already highly regarded, but primarily as a harpsichordist and organ expert. Later seen as one of the best

composers of all time – renowned for such works as the Brandenburg Concertos and his Mass in B Minor – he was one of a large family of north German musicians. He is widely praised as a great synthesiser of styles and traditions.

The St John Passion, written during his first year as director of church music in Leipzig, was designed to be used as part of a church service. It follows John 18 and 19 in the Luther Bible, but the writer of the libretto is not known. A possible earlier Passion, written in Weimar, is lost.

Nowadays the St John Passion is heard mainly in the 1739–1749 version, which was never performed in Bach's lifetime, though he made many revisions to the original before his death.

REMEMBERING BILL COLLINS

Bill was born on 30 June 1921 to his mum, Ellen, and his father, who was also called William. They lived in the London borough of Wandsworth.

Bill left school at 14½ and started work in a local radio and bicycle shop. His mum didn't think that held any future for him, so took him down to a local factory, Gambrell Bros.

The war years

With the permission of his parents, Bill, along with some of his friends, joined the local searchlight regiment Territorial Army in early 1939. Bill was called up a month before war was officially declared. A month later, Bill was sent back to 'civvy street', as his firm wanted him back in reserved occupation war work.

Bill was given an indefinite leave pass with permission to wear civilian clothes and sent back home. The ensuing three years saw the blitz and, through the factory, a Local Defence Volunteers unit was formed. In his own words, Bill said, "we were a motley crowd – no uniform, no weapons, just an armband with 'LDV' on it."

Bill was made a sergeant and worked through the daytime, then on home guard patrol at night, helping police to direct traffic. It was during this period that he got to know Gladys, his future wife. Gladys was an unofficial member of the home guard, and she and Bill often kept her dad, George, company, as he was an air raid warden in Acuba Road and Bodmin Street, where Gladys lived.

Bill was eventually re-called to the Royal Engineers in 1944. After a period of intense training, they set sail from Southampton and through the Med. They spent a week in fly infested Egypt and then moved on by rail to Port Tufick. They then boarded a Marine Commando Ops ship for the journey to India. Once they arrived in Bombay, they spent a period of time in intense training, and were

eventually told that they were joining 'Special Force' for operations in Burma behind enemy lines. After three weeks of travelling to the borders of Nepal, they were allocated to various columns. Another three weeks of marching followed, and they finally entered Burma. Their job there was to destroy enemy dumps and general sabotage, whilst avoiding conflict wherever possible. After nearly four difficult months there, with limited supplies and rations, they were flown out of Burma and back to India. Despite the ordeal of survival in the jungle, Bill felt incredibly lucky to be alive and to have avoided conflict. From there. Bill spent some time preparing landing strips in Malaya until he received the good news that it was his time to go home and be reunited with Gladys, and with his mum and dad.

Marriage and London Transport

Bill and Glad were determined to get married as soon as possible, and their wedding took place on 29 March 1947. He described this as the greatest day of his life – despite the fact that he fell over a wall on the morning of the ceremony and split his trousers! Thankfully, a neighbour who was a Canadian Soldier, had a pair of trousers that matched Bills uniform, so he borrowed those.

Shortly after this, Bill was released from the armed forces and he managed to get a job with London Transport at their Chiswick depot, a job that he would have for the next 38 years. During his time there, he became involved with the Transport and General Workers Union, becoming Branch Secretary for a period of over 20 years.

Bill and Glad's first son, Doug, was born in December 1947 and then 2 ½ years later, their second son, Bob, was born in June 1950. With 2 babies, working, and running a rifle club, which they had been involved in for several years, it's safe to say that Bill and Glad were very busy – but this is exactly how they liked to be.

The move to Woodgate

Bill and Gladys had a few house moves over the years, and in December 1986 they made the move to Orchard Gardens in Woodgate. Gladys' mum, Eleanor, moved in with them.

True to themselves, Bill and Glad immersed themselves into the local community by joining the local rifle club and helping to form the Aldingbourne and District Horticultural Society, together with the Short Mat Bowls Club. Bill also became involved with the parish council, becoming chairman before retiring in 2000. He also spent time as the driver for the community transport group, latterly using the service himself when he gave up driving.

Sadly, Gladys was diagnosed with Myeloma, a type of blood/bone cancer in 2006, and whilst treatment was successful for five years, she passed away on 24 April 2011, surrounded by her loving family.

Special memories

Bill and Glad were married for 64 wonderful years. During the next 12 years, Bill slowly came to terms with life without Glad, supported by his family and friends.

Bill's family was very important to him and he was delighted to see his grandchildren marry, and very proud of his five great grandchildren.

Some of our special memories from over the more recent years include his 95th birthday, where the family held a very special 1920's themed party for him. And, of course, he celebrated his 100th birthday with his friends and family, and not forgetting the special card from the Queen.

Bill celebrated his 102nd birthday in June those who have sadly passed before him. 2023, and was again joined by his family to celebrate this very special milestone.

The Church and church community were very important to Bill, he found great comfort from Reverand Sheila who would provide Bill with Communion and Prayer at home, and latterly at Claremont Lodge.

Bill will be remembered fondly for his love of model railways and his garden, in which he and Glad had taken great pride. And let's not forget his beloved Wimbledon and Fulham Football Club, who he had followed up and down the Leagues over the years!

Bill was always positive and his main concern was always for others. He always felt blessed with his wonderful family and friends, who gave him great love and support to the end. and he will be greatly missed by all. We can take comfort in the knowledge that he is now reunited with his beloved wife Glad, and all

So finally, in Bills own words: "Goodnight & God Bless."

The words above were written by Bill's family as part of the Eulogy for his funeral, which was held at St Mary's Aldingbourne on 5 December last year.
